(c) The Cold War	<ol> <li>to examine the origin of the Cold War.</li> <li>to trace the development of the Cold War.</li> <li>to discuss the impact of the Cold War.</li> </ol>	<ul> <li>to discuss the responsibility for the outbreak of the Cold War</li> <li>ask students to search for information on the life of the Germans in West/East Berlin during the Cold War</li> <li>Videos</li> </ul>	(cycle 22-27) (18 periods)
